Cats and dragons were once again the favorite subjects at this year's at show, although Sarah Clemens perhaps gilded the lily by showing both species in a number of her paintings. The other notable theme this year was angels, with three of the best in show being Bob Keck's luminous "Ascension of Passion", Ruth Thompson-Soden's sultry "The Fourth Sin", and Frank Cirocco's ornate "Aphrodite". David Lee Pancake wins the award for most delicious name, and his nebulous "Oceans" also scores high in artistic taste. Child-Free Lifestyle and IDIC Panels

As a new panelist, I spent the weeks before Westercon 66 preparing, preparing, preparing. I compiled notes on Star Trek, reread various science-fiction novels set in California, and selected readings for the "Page 119" panel. How refreshing to know that I qualified for two panels just because of who I am: a middle-aged, unmarried, heterosexual male with no children, but with experience living in a foreign culture. No study needed there. I've been cultivating myself in this regard for forty-seven years, so on to a certain two panels I went.

The first of these, "Child-Free Lifestyle," was comprised of panelists and audience members who decided not to have children to pursue certain professions or lifestyles, or to avoid passing on a health condition, or, as in the case of yours truly, because life progressed until "not giving it much thought" became "not for me." No one present, however, chose to remain child-free because they hate children. Much of the discussion involved how society presses us to have children, to fit in by starting families. But it is necessarily responsible to do so just because society seems to demand it? The majority answered emphatically, "no!" If children are in your life plan, and I emphasize PLAN, bless you. If they are not, bless you too.

The second panel stemmed from the Vulcan philosophy of Infinite Diversity in Infinite Combination (IDIC) and extended to a consideration of how this applies to the real world. The conversation quickly left Star Trek and moved on to an enumeration of trends in the global village that slow progress toward tolerance and acceptance. For example, the labeling of cultures or peoples as "others" perpetuates inequality. On another level, the weakening of critical thinking in education inhibits children's abilities to defend against specious arguments, like those leading to a belief in "others" needing to be brought around to "our" way of thinking. Finally, the United States, desperately in need of educational reform, needs to bolster foreign languages in the general curriculum. Let's give a shout out to our teachers, shall we? Both the panel and the audience was filled with these brave individuals, and the stories they shared provided strong evidence as to why they need and deserve our support.

I fondly hope that science-fiction conventions continue to hold panels or tracks that deal with lifestyle issues, or how science fiction relates to such issues. Each one I've experienced has been well-attended, and participants on both side of the table bring clear thoughts and fresh perspectives to any topic at hand. In the spirit of IDIC, I say live long and prosper. *Chuck Serface*
